Returning Student Registration for 2024-25

Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will once again conduct an online returning student registration process to confirm student registrations for the 2024-25 school year. Families of all current students—with the exception of graduating Grade 12 students—must complete the process to confirm the school their child plans to attend in the 2024-25 school year or advise the Division of their plans not to return to EIPS. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. The 2024-25 returning student registration takes place Feb. 8-21, 2024.

One contact for each current PALS to Grade 11 student will receive the Returning Student Registration Form link through Permission Click on February 8. The recipient is based on which contact has been identified as the one to receive forms as listed on the most recent registration form, Correction and Verification Form or Student Information Update submitted to the Division. To review the contacts listed for each student, refer to the Student Information Update available through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Only one contact can be selected to receive forms.

School Fees - Reminder

If you have outstanding school fees, please submit payment at your earliest convenience. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u> and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online. Note: School Fees are not available in the Mobile App. If you need to make arrangements to pay your fees by cheque or cash (exact change) please contact Sherri in the office.

Don't forget to log into the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, extracurricular activities and more.

Cybersecurity Update: Important information for families

As part of EIPS' ongoing commitment to maintaining a secure and effective digital learning environment for students, the Division is implementing an important update to its cybersecurity protocols **Jan. 19, 2024**.

Enhanced Location-based Security for Student Accounts

Starting Jan. 19, 2024, access to student user accounts—used for platforms like PowerSchool, Brightspace and Google—will be limited to within Canada's geographical boundaries. This change is an essential step in strengthening our cyber defenses and ensuring the digital safety of students.

What Does This Mean for You and Your Child?

Location-limited Access: Your child's account will be accessible only when they're physically located in Canada. This includes all activities related to their schoolwork, such as submitting assignments, accessing study materials or sending EIPS account emails.

Seamless In-country Use: While in Canada, students will experience no change in how they access and use their accounts. The process remains as straightforward and user-friendly as always.

PowerSchool Access for Parents and Caregivers: This change will NOT impact parent and caregiver access to PowerSchool during periods of travel.

Why This Change?

The safety and privacy of students are paramount. This location-based access control is a proactive measure to prevent unauthorized access to students' accounts and protect sensitive information from potential cyber threats.

Kindergarten Registration Starts February 1! Register by March 8

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2024? If so, it's almost time to register for kindergarten. Kindergarten registration opens for the 2024-25 school year at 9 a.m. on Feb. 1, 2024.

James Mowat Elementary encourages all families to register their kindergarten child by March 8. To help manage overall enrolment pressure in the school, kindergarten capacity is limited to two classes. Should kindergarten enrolment exceed available space, a random selection process will be used. Those selected through the random selection process attend the school. Those not selected are redirected to their alternate-designated school, Fort Saskatchewan Elementary.

Kindergarten children, who have a sibling currently attending James Mowat and returning next year, are guaranteed a spot at the school—through the sibling clause. However, that spot is only guaranteed until March 8. After March 8, the school will redirect any new student registrations, including siblings, to the alternate-designated school—unless space remains available in kindergarten at James Mowat Elementary.

To help families prepare for kindergarten, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online <u>EIPS Kindergarten Tool kit</u> to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on registration, important dates, programming options, what to expect, eligibility, how to find your designated school, transportation and more.



The Board is made up of elected representatives who are accountable to you, the families, and to the community members of a school division who have elected each trustee. For EIPS, the Board provides overall direction and leadership, accepting responsibility for the Division's policies and procedures. Inclement Weather

With the winter season well underway, we want to remind families to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.


If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will advise families of any bus cancellations or changes to school operations using various communications tools—automated-telephone messages, email, SMS, alerts posted on www.eips.ca and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations and notification through both the Bus Status and the Ride 360 apps. Morning bus cancellations are posted on www.eips.ca by 6:30 a.m.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations or changes to school operations are guided by EIPS' <u>Administrative</u> <u>Procedure 131: Inclement Weather</u>, which states: "school bus service may be suspended ... when there is a forecast or current temperature of -40 C including wind chill, in one or more regions." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services or school-related activities include adverse weather and poor road conditions.

When school bus services are suspended, schools remain open to students. EIPS believes families have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on what they feel is safest during times of inclement weather.

Calmly correct misconceptions and take time to listen.

Nicotine Products

With the rise in electronic cigarettes, vape pens, hookahs and smokeless tobacco, there are more ways than ever for youth to get hooked on nicotine. And kids are more likely to see these smoke-free alternatives as a cooler and safer way to smoke. Parents should pay attention to an unusual attachment to a USB stick, sharpie, pen, lipstick, key fob, etc. These items may be a type of e-cigarette disguised as everyday items.

Talking to Youth Matters

Research shows that youth who learn about drug risks from their parents are less likely to start using them. If you don't talk about it, your child may think it's okay to smoke or vape.

Youth who choose not to use substances are less likely to:

- · Have serious trouble in school
- Get hurt in a car accident
- Be a victim of crime
- Have substance use problems as an adult
